2017 Holy Week and Easter Festivities

Opportunities for worship, devotion and fellowship abound as we continue the season of Lent and look forward to the joy and celebration of the Eastertide season. We hope you will plan to join us as the congregation prepares for meaningful worship services during Holy Week.

Our journey to the cross begins on Palm Sunday, April 9 at 10am. Plan to join us as we wave palms together and celebrate the Triumphal Entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. We began our Lenten journey on Ash Wednesday. Palm Sunday is the doorway to yet another part of Christ's journey to the cross and our faith journey as followers of Christ.

We will gather for Maundy Thursday, April 13 at 7 which will include prayer, scripture, and story. Communion will be celebrated as we reflect on the Last Supper Jesus shared with his disciples. He prepares it for us as well and encourages us to gather around the Table. Both the Lord's Supper and the washing of hands will be done around tables which will be set up in the sanctuary.

On Good Friday, April 14 at 7pm, we will observe the Ancient Service of Tenebrae (Service of Darkness). As accounts of Jesus' last hours are read, candles will be extinguished and we will end the service in silent darkness. The Emmanuel Chancel Choir will perform selections from The

Seven Last Words of Christ by Theodore Dubois between readings. As we remember Christ's overwhelming sacrifice, let us uplift one another in Christ's love and hope and prepare ourselves for Christ's resurrection Easter morning.

Please plan to join us as we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord on Easter Sunday, April 16. Activities include the following:

7am: Easter Breakfast served until 9:30am in the fellowship hall

9:15am: Easter Egg Hunt for children on church grounds

10am: Traditional Worship Service in the sanctuary. Communion will be served.

Cowtown Cleanup in Greenway


