May this Lenten season be one of deep and abiding blessing for you.




# Lent Workshop

- A memorial reception for Hillene Unangst, a nonmember, was held at Emmanuel on Feb. 23rd

### Session

- Voted to allow BCAMP to install a security camera in Room 102 for internet streaming only during school hours.
- Voted to change the date of the EPC Yard Sale from Labor Day weekend to either Memorial Day weekend or May 20th. Also voted to set up an onsite container to store yard sale donations and advertise the event on the front parking lot for up to 90 days.
- Voted to designate the first \$4,000 received from the yard sale to the general fund and any monies over that amount 25% for children and youth, 50% for mission, and 25% for the physical plant.
- Approved a Habitat for Humanity fundraiser on Sunday, March 26th, from 5:00-7:00 PM, with the theme "Louisiana Blues", which will include a silent auction.
- Approved The Church Family Gathers for "A Very Blessed Summer" for summer intergenerational Sunday school curriculum, Project Editor Jane Kintzi.
- Learned that the Mission Trip to Amen St. Louis is scheduled for July 30th-August 5th.
- Received a report on the February 25th Grace Presbytery meeting by commissioners Jim Mahon and Fred Thompson.

# Cowtown Cleanup in Greenway


